A RESOLUTION URGING STATE LEGISLATORS TO TAKE IMMEDIATE ACTION AS PART OF THE BIENNIAL BUDGET PROCESS TO PROTECT COUNTIES AND TRANSIT AUTHORITIES AGAINST THE LOSS OF MEDICAID MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATION (MCO) SALES TAX REVENUE

It was moved by Commissioner Metzger, seconded by Commissioner Sciarretti, to approve the following:

WHEREAS, Tuscarawas county has been delegated a wide array of critical services to perform on behalf of the state,

WHEREAS, a series of state policy decisions and economic conditions have led to a period of ongoing fiscal challenge for Tuscarawas county,

WHEREAS, Tuscarawas county has experienced a growing reliance on sales tax revenue as a result,

WHEREAS, Tuscarawas County estimated amount of sales tax revenue attributed to the Medicaid managed care sales tax for 2016 is **\$674,360.27** in Tuscarawas County,

WHEREAS, the SFY 2018 – 2019 Executive State Budget proposes disparate treatment for the state and counties by recommending to fully replace forgone state sales tax and Medicaid matching dollars for the next biennium while providing counties/transit authorities with a one-time allocation that ranges from approximately 3 months to a year or more of the forgone revenue,

WHEREAS, the solution put forth in the executive budget treats the state and counties disparately and that what is needed is an equitable solution

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners hereby urge the Ohio General Assembly to take immediate action against the potential loss of approximately 5.18% of sales tax revenues associated with the Medicaid MCO sales tax by adopting an equitable solution that addresses the funding needs of the state and counties on a continuing basis.

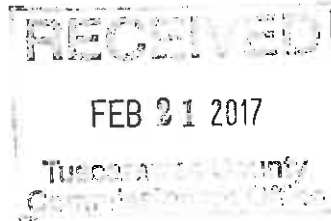

8. Additional costs for service line tracer wire

Commissioner Abbuhl called the meeting out of recess and back into Regular Session at 3:31 p.m. for the scheduled appointment with Michael Jones regarding Clean Ohio Grant and Personnel.

Discussion: Michael Jones, Sanitary Engineer and Director of the Water & Sewer Department presented a request for authorization to submit an application to participate in the Ohio Public Works Commission Clean Ohio Conservation Program for the purchase of property that will create a water protection area. They are trying to have at least 300’ buffer around each well including a future well. The proposed cost estimate of \$107,700 is based upon reasonable costs in working with Jan McInturf (Realtor). This is for 75% of the cost with 25% local match from departmental funds. These wells service areas including Zoar, Wilkshire Hills, Sandyville, Mineral City and Lawrence Township Industrial Park.

RESOLUTION (183-2017) OPWC CLEAN OHIO GRANT – WELL PROTECTION AREA

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR/SANITARY ENGINEER OF THE TUSCARAWAS COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT TO PREPARE AND SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION CLEAN OHIO CONSERVATION PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZE THE PRESIDENT OR VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE TUSCARAWAS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE “BOARD”) TO EXECUTE CONTRACTS AS REQUIRED

WHEREAS, the Board owns the Wilkshire Hills Community Water System and its associated well field, and the Tuscarawas County Metropolitan Sewer District operates and maintains said community water system on behalf of the Board, and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Public Works Commission Clean Ohio Conservation Program has grant funds that can be utilized for the purchase of a drinking water protection area around the Wilkshire Hills well field.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners, Tuscarawas County, Ohio:

Section 1: The Director/Sanitary Engineer of the Tuscarawas County Metropolitan Sewer District is hereby authorized to apply to the OPWC for Clean Ohio Conservation Program funds.

Section 2: The President or Vice-President of the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners is authorized to enter into any agreements as may be necessary and appropriate for obtaining this financial assistance.

Discussion: Michael Jones, Sanitary Engineer and Director of the Water & Sewer Department, was present to request authorization to effect staffing changes within the organization. Currently, non-bargaining unit leadership positions within Tuscarawas County Metropolitan Sewer consist of Michael Jones and Justin Angel, Superintendent who oversees field operations (total staff is 18 and some seasonal). He would like to establish 2 new non-bargaining unit supervisory positions. The Lead Water Operator is retiring after serving the county for 35-36 years. Therefore, he is requesting to leave that position vacant to create a Water Operations Supervisor position. He would like to promote from within and does have an employee that is qualified to fill the position, if that person is interested, then he would need to hire a Utility Worker. He would also like to create a position for Wastewater Operations Supervisor. They only have the budgetary capacity to hire from within for this position. If no one is available within the organization, he will leave the position vacant until they are able to fill it. These new positions would include more administrative and management duties. The Commissioners asked him to submit an updated Table of Organization.


