

Tuscarawas County Sheriff's Office Birth Certificate, Social Security Card, and State ID

Birth Certificate

If you were born ANYWHERE in Ohio, you can get a certified copy of the birth record from the Tuscarawas County Health Department. Beginning in 2010, all Ohio health departments can issue birth records for Ohio births regardless of where the birth occurred. For births that occurred outside of Ohio, see Centers for Disease Control National Center for Health Statistics.

What information do you need to provide to receive a copy of your birth certificate?: 1. Full name of person on birth certificate; 2. Date of birth; 3. Father's full name; 4. Mother's full maiden name.

You can request a copy of your birth certificate from the Tuscarawas County Health Department: *in-person* (you can stop by their office during normal business hours between 8am and 4pm, Monday-Friday (closed on holidays), and certificates are made while you wait (15 minutes or less); *by mail or by phone* with credit card payment (to request a certificate by mail, send a completed application form and mail it to Tuscarawas County Health Department Vital Records as well as a cashier's check or money order **or** call them at 330-343-5555, ext. 125 to provide a credit card payment over the phone). **COST**: \$25

Social Security Card

You can request a new Social Security replacement card: *via paper application/mail* (you would need to send in the original copies they would then send them back to you); OR *via Social Security Administration online* (you would need your driver's license or state-issued ID card in order to apply for a replacement card online (Apply using the following link: <u>https://www.ssa.gov/myaccount</u>). **COST** for a replacement Social Security Card: FREE... you are limited to 3 replacement cards in a year and 10 during your lifetime

What do you need to obtain a replacement card?: You need ORIGINAL document(s) showing: CITIZENSHIP (US Birth Certificate or US Passport) and IDENTITY (something showing your name, identifying information, a recent photograph... i.e. US driver's license, or State-issued non-driver ID, or US passport). You must present original documents or copies certified by the agency that issued them. They do NOT accept photocopies or notarized copies. All documents must be current (not expired). They cannot accept a receipt showing you applied for the document. Any documents that you mail to them will be returned to you. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE ONE OF THESE SPECIFIC DOCUMENTS OR YOU CANNOT GET A REPLACEMENT FOR ONE OF THEM WITHIN 10 DAYS, THEY WILL ASK TO SEE OTHER DOCUMENTS. Any documents submitted, including the following, must be current (not expired) and show your name, identifying information (date of birth or age) and preferably a recent photograph: Employee identification card; School identification card; Health insurance card (not a Medicare card); US military identification card.

Ohio State-Issued ID

Ohio Identification (ID) Cards are issued to Ohio residents who do not have a valid driver license. Ohio ID cards are valid for four years or eight years and there is no minimum age for obtaining one. You must provide proof of: full legal name, date of birth, Social Security number (if ever assigned), Legal presence, Ohio residency. **COST**: \$10 (no difference in price between the standard and compliant cards)

Standard Card vs. Compliant Card: Beginning May 3, 2023, the federal government will no longer consider standard driver licenses and identification cards as sufficient forms of identification for air travel. TSA (Transportation Security Administration) will require a federally-compliant driver license, identification card, or other acceptable form of identification such as a U.S. passport or military ID to fly within the U.S.

What documents do you need to obtain a STANDARD ID card?: Proof of full legal name, DOB, legal presence in US, social security number, and Ohio street address. (i.e. Birth Certificate (satisfies: full legal name, DOB, and legal presence in US); Certified Copy of court order (satisfies Social Security and Ohio Street address) or, Social Security card (satisfies social security number), or pay stub (satisfies social security and Ohio street address)... etc. If you do not have these documents, you can call the BMV to ask them about other acceptable documents OR go online to see the list of acceptable documents (https://publicsafety.ohio.gov/static/bmv2424.pdf).
