## Media Release

---

At 0815 hours the Tuscarawas County 911 center received a call from Insurance Auto Auctions (IAA) (2932 SR 259 SE New Philadelphia, Ohio) to report that as they opened the auction storage yard two (2) vehicles sped out of the lot. One was a 2020 White Dodge Charger and a 2016 Dark Gray Chevrolet Camaro. A bolo was immediately put out for the two stolen cars that were owned by IAA.

The two vehicles were spotted in the Uhrichsville area and a pursuit ensued. All surrounding law enforcement was notified. The white Dodge Charger crashed on US 36 East of Robin Road in Clay Township. The Camaro continued Westbound and was next spotted in Newcomerstown and then into Coshocton County where it was lost. The Camaro was later recovered undamaged and unoccupied near the Wal-Mart in Coshocton County.

The crash scene in Clay Township was significant, totaling the White Dodge Charger and sending the driver of that car, Lamine Mohamed Conde, Age 28, of Columbus to Mercy Medical Center in Canton, Ohio. Conde was treated and released and is being held in the Tuscarawas County Jail pending the formal filing of charges. Felony Auto theft and fleeing and eluding are expected charges among other charges relating to driving and trespassing.

The Tuscarawas County Sheriff's Office, Gnadenhutten Police, Dennison Police, Uhrichsville, Newcomerstown, OSP and Coshocton County Sheriff assisted with the pursuit. Dover and New Philadelphia Police assisted with K-9's at the crash scene when we were initially told a second suspect had fled from the crash. We now do not believe a second suspect fled on foot from that area.

Initial Investigation shows that the Dodge Charger with a SCAT PACK package was going up to 163 miles per hour when it crashed.

Detective Captain Adam Fisher is leading the investigation along with Detectives Ed Jones, Cole Morris and Crime Scene Technician Ryan Hamilton. The vehicles were impounded to be processed for physical evidence.
