PRESENTATION/DISCUSSION – Youth to Youth – National Drug & Alcohol Facts Week Proclamation

Jessica Sexton (Youth Facilitator), Kayli Luthy (Youth Coordinator), Piper Olson (Sophomore at Tusc. Central Catholic/Youth to Youth) and Chlorissa Currman (Senior at Strasburg/Youth to Youth) were present to request approval of a proclamation. Jodi Salvo could not attend due to a big grant that she is working on.

Ms. Olson explained the National Drug & Alcohol Facts Week is an annual, week-long, health observance that inspires dialogue about the science of drug use and addiction among youth. This was launched in 2010 by scientists at the National Institute on Drug Abuse to stimulate educational events in communities so teens can learn what science has taught us about drug use and addiction adding that students, teachers, community members, and organizations across the United States are participating in NDAFW.

The slogan for this year is “I shatter the myths”. Ms. Olson stated that she “shatters the myths” because she wants her friends to have a good academic career, stay healthy and drug free. At TCC, they are putting posters in bathrooms to educate youth. Ms. Currman stated that Strasburg schools “shatters the myths” by having a spirit week (one day is lay off the drugs with Hawaiian shirts and lei’s, be proud to be drug free – American attire, to name a few). This is a fun yet effective way to get the slogan out to the youth. Ms. Sexton added that Tuscarawas Valley Schools have a large bulletin board that has information in 5 sections and each day they remove the cloth covering to unveil the information for that day. Ms. Luthy stated the Claymont Schools will have informational posters out as well as a scavenger hunt to find answers to questions. There is also a “cahoots” link which is a type of jeopardy where they post a question on a smart board then use the iPad to answer. This is a fun way to educate students.

When asked if the effects of the pandemic increased drug usage, the answer is yes, when kids were not in school they had more access to drugs but once the schools were back in session, Youth to Youth promoted not using drugs and showed that there are students that are drug free so they do not have to resort to drug use.

They also described the state "We are the majority walk" at the State Capitol building. This is a chance for schools to come together state-wide with hundreds of passionate kids. The group gets so big they have to cap participation as they do not have a space big enough for everyone to attend.

The most effective strategy is to lead by example, when students see other students are standing up to be drug free, they show others that you can thrive in real life without leaning towards alcohol, drugs, and nicotine.

Commissioner Sciarretti complimented those in attendance on their incredible personalities which are contagious and persuasive. They are leaders and have a phenomenal impact on their peers that will last forever.

Commissioner Abbuhl stated that Ms. Olson and Ms. Currman are leaders not only in sports but in the community as well. They are making a positive impression on those the same age and younger. Some people do not have a good home life or guidance at home so they choose to turn to alcohol and drugs. The type of leaders you are continues to bring such a positive message to generations. Your efforts really do have an impact on people.

Commissioner Landis is so proud to know these individuals and to be associated with the organization. He looks forward to seeing them every time they are engaged in the community. It is important for leaders and elected officials, leading by example, to try to do the right thing.

"National Drug and Alcohol Facts Week®" Proclamation

WHEREAS, *National Drug and Alcohol Facts Week®* is sponsored by the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) and the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA) at the National Institutes of Health, in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, in accordance with other federal and private partner organizations, to encourage teens to ask questions about drugs, drug abuse, alcohol, and alcoholism, and receive scientifically based facts and answers in return, and

WHEREAS, *National Drug and Alcohol Facts Week®* is a celebration of the inquisitive minds of teenagers and encourages them to ask questions drugs, drug abuse, alcohol, and alcoholism and get scientifically based answers, without judgment or biased comment.

WHEREAS, *National Drug and Alcohol Facts Week®* celebrates the efforts of national and community organizations working with teens to encourage this science based conversation about drugs, drug abuse, alcohol, and alcoholism, and

WHEREAS, In 2018, the Tuscarawas County Community Health Assessment results indicated that more than 35 percent of Tuscarawas County youth (grades 6-12) had drunk at least one drink of alcohol in their life, increasing to 60 percent of youth seventeen and older; and

WHEREAS, the Tuscarawas County Community Health Assessment results indicated that 16 percent of youth thought that there was no risk in using marijuana once or twice a week; and

WHEREAS, the Tuscarawas County Community Health Assessment results indicated that 63 percent of Tuscarawas County youth identified as current smokers were also current drinkers, defined as having a drink of alcohol in the past 30 days; and

WHEREAS, Tuscarawas County Youth to Youth has chosen Tuscarawas County to officially launch our local efforts,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESLOVED, that the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners, does hereby proclaim the week of March 22- March28, 2021, as *National Drug and Alcohol Facts Week®* and encourages Tuscarawas County citizens to support and participate in drug prevention education activities, making a statement that we are strongly committed to a drug-free state.
