ENGINEER CR 82 SAFETY STUDY

Joe Bachman, County Engineer, attended the Commissioners meeting to discuss the CR 80/82 safety study, and the potential application for federal grant funds to improve CR82 and CR80 intersection. Mr. Bachman noted that this was a study through ODOT and OMEGA, which examined high accident areas on local roads. Mr. Bachman added that this intersection had been reviewed in 2003, but a previous Board of Commissioners decided not to make any changes to the intersection. Mr. Bachman was requesting a letter of support because of that prior Board's decision, and that he could show in the grant process that the current Board supported the Engineer's application.

Commissioner Landis asked that since the study pointed out that this intersection is a problem, if no action were taken and then there were to be further accidents, even fatalities, could this be a legal issue for the county? Mr. Bachman noted that he was not sure about the answer to that question, and that is a question better suited for legal counsel. Commissioner Abbuhl added that he felt as though there could potentially be a legal issue for the county in the case Commissioner Landis mentioned.

Commissioner Sciarretti raised a question on the control the county would have over the project, and if the county would surrender its control over the project to the Federal Government. Joe Bachman noted that the county will have some control but the county would have to meet federal standards. However, Mr. Bachman did note, the county would likely be able to do the design itself. Doing the design in-house would allow the county to work with local residents on a situation that was suitable for all parties.

Joe Weaver, whose family owns a farm along this intersection, stated that he understood there is a problem at this intersection and something needs to be done. However, Mr. Weaver noted that he just did not want to see his property be destroyed. Mr. Bachman noted that the 2003 design had the project taking place entirely in the right-of-way, but he was unsure of what the new design, and any differences from 2003, would include. Commissioner Sciarretti pointed out on a map that one area would be lowed and another area of the intersection would be raised, which would increase line of sight.

Mr. Ziegler's concerns centered on how he would access his farmland. Mr. Ziegler noted that he can access his farmland anywhere along Dover-Zoar Road (CR82), and he was concerned how he would be able to access his farmland if the road area along the road was raised four feet. Mr. Bachman stated that there were a few options that could be taken to remedy this concern. One option would be the county putting in place a driveway so Mr. Ziegler could access his fields. Second, according to Mr. Bachman, the county could add a grade along the road, which would allow Mr. Ziegler to access his farmland anywhere along the road. Mr. Bachman added that he understood Mr. Ziegler's concerns and did not feel as though this concern was unwarranted.

Mr. Weaver stated that traffic on the road has clearly increased, and wondered if other measures, such as a four way stop could be taken. Commissioner Sciarretti asked if rumble strips or some other measure to alert drivers could be a solution. Mr. Bachman stated that he felt as though an intersection could exacerbate the problem, and added that many local governments are moving away from things such as rumble strips or speed bumps. Mr. Ziegler raised concerns that improving the road and intersection could result in increased speed and consequently result in more accidents. Joe Bachman said that all the county can do is review the statistics. For example, Mr. Bachman noted that widening a road, by even a small amount, can reduce accidents by 20%. According to Mr. Bachman, the line of sight could be improved and there could still be severe accidents at the intersection. However, Mr. Bachman added that according to the statistics, improving line of sight at this intersection could lower accidents and increase safety. Mr. Landis pointed out that increasing the line of sight could make those using farm equipment more visible to drivers along the road. Commissioner Abbuhl agreed, adding that it is difficult to control human behavior, but keeping the study in mind, some action needs to be taken to improve safety of the road.

Commissioner Landis stated that his key priorities in making this decision concerned safety, property rights, and livelihood. Commissioner Sciarretti asked when this project could start if the grant was approved. Mr. Bachman said that with the federal process, his office is applying for a grant for funding a project that would likely not start for at least two years.

Mr. Ziegler stated that there is a clear problem at this intersection and that he was confident a solution could be worked out. Mr. Weaver agreed, noting that he was confident a sensible and common sense solution could be worked out between all the parties. Commissioner Sciarretti stated that coming into the meeting he did have some reservations, however, he was pleased to say that those reservations had been minimized because of the dialogue and the understanding that the Engineer would work with the property owners on a sensible solution.

RESOLUTION (440-2019) CR 80/82 ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

It was moved by Commissioner Abbuhl, seconded by Commissioner Landis, to hereby support the application of the Tuscarawas County Engineer for road safety improvements at the intersection of County Road 80 and County Road 82 with the understanding the County Engineer will review and address all issues regarding landowner ingress and egress to their perspective properties.
