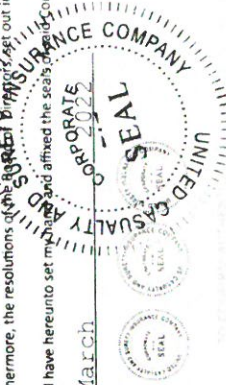



Discussion: *Commissioner Metzger has concerns with this liquor permit. Mr. Metzger would like to have the Anti-Drug Coalition (ADC) contact Base Properties, LLC. There needs to be some kind of strategic plan in place as to how you address having alcohol in a baseball complex when there will be youth leagues there as well. There needs to be some guideline as to how the alcohol will be dealt with when the youth are there. When dealing with drugs or alcohol of any kind with the relationship of youth in our community there needs to be a strategy as to how we prevent this from occurring and how this leads to more youth accepting this as the normal.*

Commissioner Landis thought what Mr. Metzger said was very good. The Liquor Permit does not go into any detail as how the alcohol will be served. Mr. Landis is hoping there is a section, like a clubhouse, where the alcohol is sold and consumed. Mr. Landis hopes people are not walking around with open containers and the alcohol is not down by the fields where the youth are going to be.

Discussion: *Molly McMath, Executive Director, of COMPASS, the Rape Crisis Center that serves Tuscarawas, Carroll and Stark Counties. Ms. McMath was present today representing Tusc. Against Trafficking. January marks National Awareness Month for Human Trafficking. Human Trafficking affects individuals, families and our communities. Tusc. Against Trafficking has been working very hard to raise awareness against trafficking. Tuscarawas County is not exempt from this and has added and contributed to the numbers in the state of Ohio and the United States. To really make an impact in the community, Tusc. Against Trafficking really needs the backing of leadership. Tusc. Against Trafficking thanked the Commissioners for the proclamation and stated the proclamation will help the work against trafficking moving forward.*

Commissioner Abbuhl appreciates the work being done by COMPAS and Tusc. Against Trafficking. The work is not fun, but has brought about awareness in trying to stop these types of things from happening.

Commissioner Landis stated human trafficking is like a "behind the scenes crime". It does not always make the front page of the paper and is more prevalent than one would like to think in the state of Ohio. There are areas with multiple interstates or turnpikes that make for easy escape routes. It is known that truck drivers have played a key role in the trafficking and abductions, but they have also helped in identifying traffickers as well. Not all trafficking is abductions, people often concentrate on cases where someone is abducted or taken. Some of the smaller communities like our own, trafficking is happening right in our homes. People are grooming our children. They are preying on the mothers and fathers' weaknesses, the needs they have. Promising to provide for them and take care of their families. Trafficking can be happening and that same person can sit down to dinner with his/her family that night. It is a crime that can happen under the radar. Everyone needs to be aware because we need everyone to watch and speak up when they are seeing activity that just does not seem right. Commissioner Landis followed up with asking what type of activities should we be watching for? Ms. McMath stated there is sex trafficking and labor trafficking. It is best to look for abnormalities in behavior, does a person have access to their own documents/money, a child that is all of sudden wearing expensive clothing, or hanging out with people who are older than themselves. Human trafficking is often times associated with drug addiction. The trafficker gets a person addicted to drugs and then withholds the drug until the addict does whatever the trafficker tells the addict to do.

Commissioner Metzger thanked Ms. McMath for the organization and all that is done for these organizations in trying to alleviate this issue here in Tuscarawas County. Everything being done is greatly appreciated and keep up the good work.

Commissioner Abbuhl talked about signs along the highway that say "work available", "modeling", things along those lines. Some of those signs are legitimate businesses, but some signs just have phone numbers and no name of a business. Even the ones that are legitimate can mask the criminal activity

deeper into the organization as part of the grooming process. Tusc. Against Trafficking's biggest message to get out to the community is to "talk and build relationships". This is the best way to fight human trafficking of all types is to build relationships with each other. There are people that are at high risk, but everyone is at risk for human trafficking. People who have stronger relationships have more of a support system. The people that feel alone, feel they have needs that are not being met, are the ones that traffickers can so easily prey upon. We just need to encourage everyone to build those relationships.

Commissioner Landis asked if online activity was a prime factor for trafficking and preying on the vulnerable. Ms. McMath stated traffickers are very patient. They will put in the time and energy it takes to groom and individual. The term "grooming" means building that relationship. Trying to meet their needs that are currently unmet. Being online is less risky than driving up in the van and taking someone right off of the street. The majority of people are still focused on trafficking only happening by abductions. The focus needs to shift to how someone can groom a child right under everyone's nose and not notice. It happens in school, after school activities, online, right in the home, almost anywhere. Build those relationships and talk, talk, talk.

Discussion: *John Fondriest, Chairman of Regional Planning and Jill Lengler, Director of Regional Planning were present to talk about upcoming changes to the Regional Planning Department. Jill Lengler, Director of Regional Planning is retiring after 16 years of service. Regional Planning is throwing around some ideas of how Regional Planning will look in the future. The Board of Regional Planning came up with some options and would like the Commissioners support and input. No decisions have been made yet. Everything is still in the brain-storming phase.*

- *Do we hire a full-time director with the expertise to do multiple jobs. (i.e. Regional Planning, Floodplain, and possibly more studies for the county)?*
- *Promoting existing staff and share the floodplain duties with another office (is the floodplain position more suitable for another department).*
- *Promoting existing staff and keeping the office as is and hire someone to help support Rhonda, Hoffmeyer.*
- *Disband Regional Planning, the board did not think this was a viable solution, but it is an option.*
- *There is a county option to do away with the Regional part of the office and it becomes a county office.*

Since 2004, the Regional Planning Office has never asked for or received an increase from the County Commissioners to the Regional Planning Board. The county subsidizes Regional Planning for \$60,000 and there has not been an increase in 18 years. It has been tight a few times, and hours were cut back to save money and not have to ask for more. Commissioner Abbuhl noted the county's contribution is based on population. Originally it was \$60,000, but has been raised to \$61,000. The structure has not changed much, but the amount went up a little based on population. As a board, the Planning Board is willing to look at things on their end that they can do also to conserve. Mr. Fondreist said the first thing that needs to be taken care of is what the Regional Planning Board and the Board of County Commissioners want Regional Planning to look like going forward after June when Jill Lengler retires.

Commissioner Metzger asked Mr. Fondriest why the option of moving to a County Planning Commission is not something the Regional Planning Board would agree too. Mr. Fondriest stated this could be looked into more and get better answers. Whether you are county or regional, you are still going to have hire a person or two. When looking at a \$130,000 - \$135,000 budget and Regional Planning is running about 80% of that in wages, the tradeoff is what do we gain by doing that? Mr. Abbuhl and Mr. Fondriest want a better understanding as to what the difference is between what the county and the regional could look like. The regional is not multi-county, but could be, but it is regionally within Tuscarawas County and includes all of the municipalities, townships, villages, and the county itself. Even if we were a county, we could still incorporate the municipalities and the townships as part of the county. The Boards need to have Robert Stephenson, II, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney, look over this option and provide a better understanding. If Regional Planning goes to a county entity, they would report to the Commissioners. If Regional Planning goes to a regional entity, who would they report too? The two boards will need to come up with a plan that is best for the county. Commissioner Abbuhl stated his understanding is "you can still have a county or regional if it is only going to be within the county and still have the participation of all of those individuals we talked about. The only difference it appears to me is that they would report directly to the County Commissioners or they would report to the Board." Legal still needs to look into this further.

Jill Lengler, Director of Regional Planning stated this concept is twofold. If it is a County Planning Commission, the County Commissioners appoint the board, the Commissioners are on it, and members are appointed that represent the municipalities, townships and villages. It is kind of like the U.S. Government, you elect a rep to go to the government or you have direct vote. This way all members have a vote, so they have more of a direct say instead of just one person representing them. The other thing is there would be income lost because each entity pays to help the planning commission operate.

Commissioner Abbuhl added if you have a regional Commission, all memberships can be part of the Regional Commission, but if you have a County Commission the members are appointed. The regional commission has a member from every entity of which the commissioners appoint members. The county planning option has an 8-member board appointed by the commissioners, there is not a member from every entity. Commissioner Metzger asked Jane Clay, Executive Assistant, to look up the Regional Planning revenue for this budget. The revenue coming in is about \$97,000 and the budget is \$135,000. There is a checks and balance process that has to be done in order to change this office from Regional to County. Legal needs to be involved in this decision.

Commissioner Metzger asked what the thought would be about moving the Regional Planning Office to an outside facility. Ms. Lengler stated that Regional Planning works so closely with the map office it would not work. Mr. Metzger asked in what way would it not work. Ms. Lengler stated the county would have to pay for another station that the GIS office has, a plotter for copies, if there are questions, Regional Planning can just go to the map office and get them answered right away, being close to the GIS Office and also the Economic & Community Development Office. Having all the offices in the same place saves time and money.
