Discussion: Commissioner Metzger welcomed Cody Petit from the State Treasurer Sprague's Office. Mr. Petit stated he was in the area and just wanted to drop in and visit with the Commissioners. Mr. Petit did mention the Treasurer's Office has been working on some programs like Results Ohio, which allows a way to encourage innovation in government by making an agreement with a private organization/non-profit, which states the business entity will be fronting the start-up cost and if they are successful and meet certain metrics as evaluated by a third party who is not the state or the private organization/non-profit, they will get their money back and any interest for the pilot project. The first one is in Appalachian, Ohio, through the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio. The program will be mobile vision clinics. If the Foundation is successful in increasing test scores for those students who received better eye care, they will get their start-up money back plus interest. This is a project Treasurer Sprague is passionate about.

Another project is getting Ohio Gains through legislature, and it would help farmers by lifting the cap on the AG Link Program, run the program year-round so there is not an application period, and it will also help with financing for hospitals and higher educational institutes debt management.

Commissioner Landis thanked Treasurer Sprague for his leadership and his keen interest in Tuscarawas County and also Cody Petit for representing him.

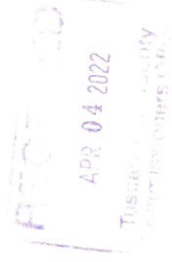

**BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
TUSCARAWAS COUNTY, OHIO**

The Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") of Tuscarawas County, Ohio (the "County"), met in regular session on April 6, 2022 at 1:00 p.m., at 125 East High Avenue, New Philadelphia, Ohio 44663, with the following members present:

Mr. Al Landis introduced the following resolution and moved its passage:

RESOLUTION (291-2022)

**RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO
LEVY A RENEWAL TAX IN EXCESS OF THE
TEN-MILL LIMITATION**

(R.C. Sections 5705.03, 5705.222)
(R.C. Chapter 5126)
Renewal DD Levy

WHEREAS, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation will be insufficient to provide for the necessary requirements of the Tuscarawas County Board of Developmental Disabilities, Ohio (the "DD Board"), a board subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Board is currently levying a 1.70 mill levy for a period of ten years for the purpose of providing funds for the operation of facilities used for retardation and developmental disabilities programs and services including Starlight School and Starlight Workshop, a school for mentally retarded and disabled students and adults (the "Existing Levy"), which Existing Levy is a levy outside the ten-mill limitation and was approved by the voters of the County on November 6, 2012, and first placed on the tax list and duplicate in 2013 for collection beginning in 2014 (Tax Collection Years 2014-2023); and

WHEREAS, the DD Board passed a resolution, dated March 28, 2022, requesting the Board to seek voter approval to renew all of the Existing Levy for the purpose of providing for the operation of community programs and services authorized by county boards of developmental disabilities, for the acquisition, construction, renovation, financing, maintenance, and operation of developmental disabilities facilities, or for both of such purposes; and

WHEREAS, a resolution declaring the necessity of renewing the Existing Levy must be passed and certified to the County Auditor of Tuscarawas County in order to permit the Board to consider the renewal of such a tax and must request that the County Auditor certify to the Board the total current tax valuation of the County and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the tax;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Tuscarawas County, Ohio, two-thirds of all of the members elected thereto concurring, that:

Section 1. It is necessary to renew all of the Existing Levy, which is a tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation for the DD Board, for the purpose of providing for the operation of community programs and services authorized by county boards of developmental disabilities, for the acquisition, construction,

renovation, financing, maintenance, and operation of developmental disabilities facilities, or for both of such purposes.

Section 2. The question of renewing the Existing Levy shall be submitted to all the electors of the entire territory of the County at the election to be held therein on November 8, 2022. All of the territory of the DD Board is in Tuscarawas County, Ohio.

Section 3. Such renewal levy shall be at an annual rate not exceeding 1.70 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$0.17 for each one hundred dollars of valuation, upon the entire territory of the County, for a period of ten years.

Section 4. Such renewal levy shall be placed upon the tax list and duplicate for the 2023 tax year (commencing in 2023, first due in calendar year 2024), if a majority of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof.

Section 5. The Clerk of this Board is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the County Auditor of the County. This Board hereby requests that the County Auditor certify to this Board the total current tax valuation of the County and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the levy if approved by the voters of the County.

Section 6. All formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22.

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Discussion – Board of DD Level Renewal: *Commissioner Metzger asked Nate Kamban, Superintendent of Tuscarawas Board of Developmental Disabilities (TuscBDD) if it was in the state code that the word “retardation” had to be used. Mr. Kamban replied the previous levy language must be used in its entirety. Mr. Kamban stated the renewal will have the language removed. Commissioner Landis had the same question.*

Mr. Kamban stated TuscBDD has spent the last year looking over the finances and the long-term plan for the County Board of Developmental Disabilities. Over the past several years, there has been an increase in the number of people being served by TuscBDD, especially in youth and young adults. There needs to be local services here to keep Tuscarawas County kids with disabilities here in Tuscarawas County. Whether that is through expansion efforts at Starlight School, construction of new homes to serve youth with disabilities that were previously in settings/institutions as far away as Arkansas, Florida and other placements. This 10-year tax levy needs to be renewed in order to sustain the new projects, long-term goals and continue to be the leader across Ohio by serving people with disabilities. This is what TuscBDD has become known for across the state and they would like to keep this legacy going for the people being served and the community.

Commissioner Metzger raised the question as to whether taxes would increase or is this levy just a renewal? Mr. Kamban stated this levy is just a renewal, no new tax increases to the public.

Discussion – Child Abuse Prevention Month: *Commissioner Metzger stated this is Child Abuse Prevention Month. Why is it necessary to designate a month as a Child Abuse Prevention Month? The statistics mentioned in the Proclamation will answer that question. In 2021 there were 1,632 calls regarding child abuse/neglect, 408 child abuse/neglect investigations, 888 children involved and 74 children placed in Foster Care. Looking at the total population of children from the 2020 Census in*

Tuscarawas County under the age of 18, that equates to 3.3% of the youth living in Tuscarawas County were investigated for child abuse/neglect issues. That percentage is absolutely unacceptable, and we have to find ways to bring this number down. The residents of Tuscarawas County need to know the insidious nature of child abuse/neglect and its negative impact in our communities.

The root problems that lay the foundation for child abuse/neglect must be the main focus: drugs, domestic violence and sexual abuse. These three problems must be addressed. Mr. Metzger was able to address the drug issue with the work he does with Empower Tusc., it is getting hard and harder to change the perception of illegal drugs because we keep getting told we need to legalize marijuana. If you lower the perception of harm, it increases youth participation. There are studies that prove this. This is Child Abuse Prevention month, and the word "PREVENTION" needs to be stressed. Prevention is all about education and awareness. The pinwheels are one aspect to bringing awareness to this problem, and this is a good representation that all of the public sees during the month of April on the Courthouse steps. This Proclamation is also bringing education and awareness to this problem, The Commissioners are in total support of continuing this effort to educate and make people aware. The Commissioners would like to thank all of the Tuscarawas County agencies and community organizations who over the years have provided the leadership and focus on this very important issue of child abuse/neglect here in the county.

Commissioner Landis commented he was shocked at the number of cases that are investigated. This is when the Commissioners really started talking about the addiction crisis and all this brings with it and the mental health issues. We have got to do better. Thank you for the pinwheels. Having that annual reminder is a stark reminder of a problem that is so prevalent here in our nation and Tuscarawas County. For people driving by the courthouse and seeing this, it should be a constant reminder that we need to do better from a Legislative side, from a public leader side and also from the parental side. We need adults to help battle these causes that lead to this crisis.

Mandy Willett, Executive Director, Kristen Shoup, Board Member of Noah's Hope, Heather Morris, Supervisor of the Child Protective Unit of Job & Family Services (JFS), Lisa Sidoti, Executive Administrative Director, TuscBDD and Barb Limbacher, Voice of All Children Award Recipient were present. At Noah's Hope, they primarily work with sexual abuse. However, if drugs are sold or in the home, these are felony charges/cases, they will come to Noah's Hope. The number of cases has risen dramatically from 78 interviews in 2018-2019, 119 interviews in 2020 to 152 interviews in 2021. Noah's Hope is trying to reach as many people as they can and get an early start on the prevention aspect. Commissioner Metzger read the following Proclamation:

RESOLUTION (292-2022)

PROCLAMATION – CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

It was moved by Commissioner Landis, seconded by Commissioner Metzger, to approve the following resolution proclaiming April 2022 as Child Abuse Prevention Month.

Proclamation

Whereas, our nation recognizes each April as Child Abuse Prevention Month and many Tuscarawas County Agencies and organizations work together to heighten awareness and draw attention to the need for preventing child abuse in our communities; and

Whereas, in 2021, there were 408 child abuse/neglect investigations which involved 888 children and 74 children were placed into foster care. Noah's Hope Child Advocacy Center served 152 children by completing forensic interviews, victim advocacy, and referrals to wrap around services. Tuscarawas Job and Family Services, Noah's Hope Child Advocacy Center, Law Enforcement, as well as Alexa the Facility Dog all collaborated with each other to better combat and prevent child abuse and neglect in Tuscarawas County; and

Whereas, Tuscarawas County will display pinwheels representing the 1,632 calls regarding child abuse and neglect in Tuscarawas County, a majority due to drugs, domestic violence, and sexual abuse; and

Whereas, Pinwheels for Prevention represents the efforts to change the way our nation thinks about prevention, focusing on community activities and public policies that prioritize prevention right from the start and make sure child abuse and neglect never occur; and

Whereas, Pinwheels for Prevention focuses on the importance of talking about what each individual can do to make sure children in the community grow up safely and are encouraging students and residents to take photos wearing blue, and post the photos to the Tuscarawas County Family and Children's First Council, Job and Family Services, The Child Advocacy Center, Noah's Hope, and Latino Cultural Connections Facebook pages; and

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Tuscarawas County, Ohio, to proclaim April as **CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH** and extend, on behalf of all the people of Tuscarawas County, our sincere thanks to all agencies and organizations collaborating to raise awareness about child abuse in Tuscarawas County. We hope these organizations will continue to serve the community in such an outstanding manner and we offer our wholehearted support to the Pinwheels for Prevention campaign.

Discussion – Child Abuse Prevention Month: Commissioner Metzger stated during this time, there is always a special moment when an individual or organization is presented an award for all of the work they do for children throughout Tuscarawas County. It is called the Voice of All Children Award and Mandy Willett will be presenting this award.

Ms. Willett stated the pandemic has cancelled this award ceremony for the last two years. Noah's Hope is very excited to present this award in person again. Barb Limbacher is the recipient and would have been two years ago as well. Barb has been part of the committee for 15 years. She has been a correspondent with the Times Reporter for 41 years and her journey with the committee started with her writing a story about a puppy mill and the animal abuse. Marty Briem, who was the director of Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) at the time contacted Barb to be part of the committee and ever since then, she has been a very active member and everything she does for the children of the county is appreciated. It is believed that there is a tie between animal abuse and child abuse, those who abuse animals typically end up abusing children also.

Commissioner Metzger stated it is an honor and well-deserved award for all of the work Barb has done for children. This is an extremely prestigious award Barb should be recognized throughout Tuscarawas County communities for her hard and sincere work in trying to help prevent abuse. Barb stated kids are a passion to her, she loves kids. Commissioner Landis thanked Barb for her years of dedication to the cause, she is a pillar in the community, her passion for children is obvious and sincere.
