RESOLUTION (387-2022) APPROVE ALLOCATION – LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUND

It was moved by Commissioner Landis, seconded by Commissioner Metzger, to approve the allocation of \$900,000 of the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund – Revenue Loss replacement monies for construction of a County Maintenance Building.

Revenue Loss Replacement is an eligible expenditure that fall under the category section 6 specifically 6.1 Provision of government Services of the U.S. Treasury guidance of allowable uses of recovery funds.

Discussion: *Commissioner Abbuhl stated this has been a long time in coming for the Maintenance Department. Mr. Abbuhl wanted to identify for the record that our Maintenance Department houses a lot of equipment and things they need in the historic building of the courthouse and it never made logical sense to have them there, but there was no place to put them. Once the building is constructed, the Maintenance Department will have a place to get equipment out of the weather and be able to do work out there without disrupting any of the courts. This is a very good expenditure of the ARPA funds to be able to use those dollars for something that is going to last for decades for county use.*

RESOLUTION (388-2022) APPROVE ALLOCATION – LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUND

It was moved by Commissioner Metzger, seconded by Commissioner Landis, to approve the allocation of \$345,000 of the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund – Revenue Loss replacement monies for purchase of public property for the future construction of a County multi-purpose Facility that will house the Board of Elections.

Revenue Loss Replacement is an eligible expenditure that fall under the category section 6 specifically 6.1 Provision of government Services of the U.S. Treasury guidance of allowable uses of recovery funds.

Discussion: *Commissioner Landis stated this has been an ongoing mission. Mr. Landis thanked everyone involved, the Stokey family, Mayor Day, Ron McAbier, City of New Philadelphia, Service Director's Office and everyone else who helped pull this together. This step is just getting us to the starting line now, but it is an important piece of the puzzle. The commissioners did their due diligence in seeking out this property.*

Jane Clay, Executive Assistant, noted to make the resolution a little clearer, it should have read "for purchase of public property for the future construction of a County multi-purpose Facility."

WHEREAS, Days of Prayer have been called for since 1775, when the Continental Congress designated a time for prayer in forming a new nation; and

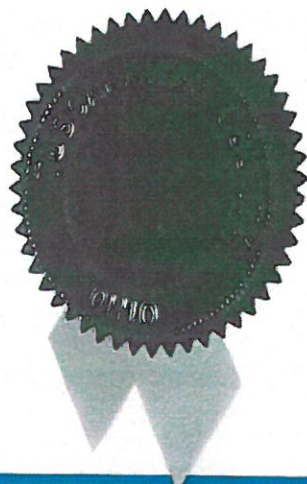


