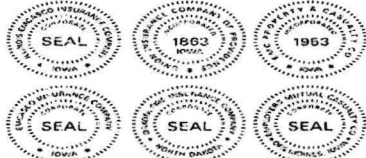

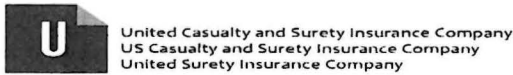

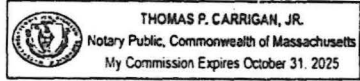

OTHER BUSINESS: *Commissioner Ress talked about possibly setting back a certain amount of money each year to put towards updating the software technology for the courthouse and county office building. The HR department is behind this idea. The technology needs to be brought up to the 21st Century. This will be a major undertaking, but needs to be done.*

Commissioner Zemis stated there are currently funds set aside for IT's software that has been put out for bid. Commissioner Zemis stated the new funds to be set aside would be used for future upgrades to the software, licensing agreements and compatibility with other county departments if that is a possibility.

Commissioner Abbuhl stated the Auditor can create a specific fund to set aside an amount at budget time. We would need to get an idea of what the cost would be, get a timeline and then determine how much money we would want to contribute to the fund.

TuscBDD: *Kerri Silverthorn, Community Relations/Special Projects Director was present with Nate Kamban, Superintendent, TuscBDD, Mary Jacobs, AFS, Donavon Nolan and Lauren Clay who are both TuscBDD residents.*

Ms. Silverthorn stated TuscBDD was present for the Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month. There will be different events going on during the month. There will be a Launch Party for Advocacy Day at the State House in Columbus and there will also be a public Launch Party at the TuscBDD offices for anyone who would like to attend. TuscBDD received a grant from the Autism Society of Ohio to give every first-grade class in Tuscarawas County a book about inclusion and it will be a different book each year. The rockets are having a friendship game towards the middle of March. There will be a short story contest for people that TuscBDD serves, talent show, a free dinner with a movie called "UNSEEN" at Buckeye Career Center (BCC) on March 23, 2023 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. this is the big awareness piece for the month.

Nate Kamban, Superintendent, stated Donavon and Lauren both attend Advocates for Success which is one of the biggest growing providers in the County that really focuses on employment. There have been big head ways made in the terms of employment and businesses helping developmental disabled people have work and make a difference. Donavon will be going back to Drug Mart. Lauren works at Dutch Valley and cleans the Bolivar Community Church.






