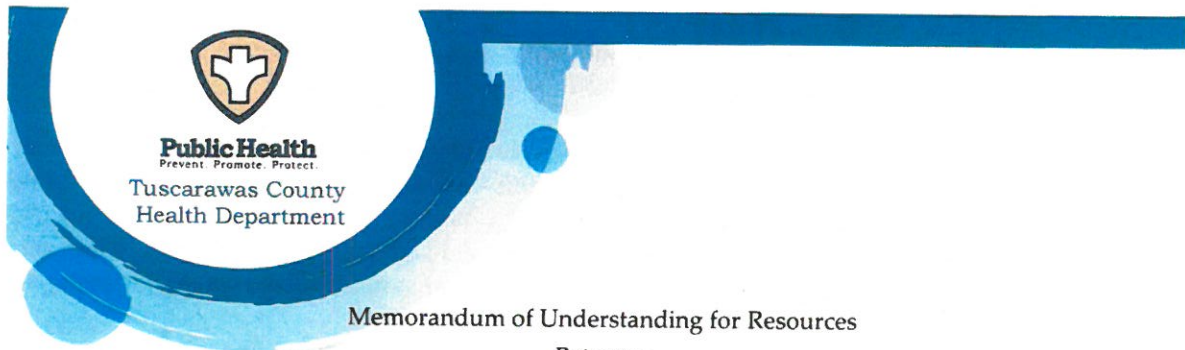

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) set for the terms of understanding between the Tuscarawas County Health Department (TCHD) and the Tuscarawas County Homeland Security (HS) and Emergency Management Agency (EMA) to assist with the sourcing of resources that may be needed during an escalating or emergent public health emergency.

The Tuscarawas County Health Department has the obligation to gain access to resources during an emergent or escalating public health emergency 24/7. This MOU establishes the agreement between both parties that the Tuscarawas County Health Department may contact the Tuscarawas County HS & EMA 24/7 to gain assistance with sourcing resources such as bottled water, personal protective equipment, the use of MARC's radio's, etc.

This MOU may be modified by mutual consent of authorized officials from the Tuscarawas County Health Department and the Tuscarawas County HS & EMA. This MOU is effective upon signature by the authorized officials and will remain in effect until modified.

**RESOLUTION (440-2022) APPROVE UPDATED PERSONNEL MANUAL SECTION 4.5 – EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT POLICY**

It was moved by Commissioner Landis, seconded by Commissioner Metzger, to approve the following updated Tuscarawas County Personnel Manual Section 4.5 – Expense Reimbursement Policy, as recommended by Kris Lowdermilk, HR Manager.

**SECTION 4.5 EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT**

Employees or authorized individuals are eligible for expense reimbursement only when travel has been authorized in writing by the Employer, subject to a final approval by the Commissioners pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 325.20.

**Mileage, Parking and Tolls**

Employees or authorized individuals shall be reimbursed for actual miles while on approved official county business at the rate established by the Board of Commissioners, when using their personal vehicle. Such payment is considered to be total reimbursement for all vehicle-related expenses (e.g., gas, oil, depreciation, etc.). Mileage reimbursement is payable to only 1 of 2 or more individuals traveling on the same trip, in the same vehicle.

When an employee or an authorized individual is required to travel out of state on official County business, the Employer may require such individual to use public transportation such as airlines, bus lines, and/or passenger service railways. Such public transportation may be required in lieu of a person using his personal or County vehicle. Employees or authorized individuals are required to submit a proposed travel itinerary to the Employer, at least 14 days in advance or as practical of the departure date. Such itinerary will include the cost of a round-trip ticket (coach fare) for public transportation, the estimated round-trip automobile mileage and miscellaneous expenses as needed. The Employer or designated representative shall review the itinerary and determine what type of travel shall be authorized. When determining/authorizing such travel, the cost of public transportation versus automobile mileage reimbursement, as well as travel time, shall be considered.

Charges incurred for car rental, parking at the destination and any highway tolls are reimbursable at the actual amount. Receipts for parking costs and highway tolls are required.

No expense reimbursements are paid for travel between home and office.

**Meals**

Expenses incurred for meals while in the performance of County business or when authorized to represent the County, and when such business occurs outside of the County, will be reimbursed at actual cost. Daily maximum(s) established by the Board of County Commissioners and defined herein may be adjusted as the geography and seasonality dictate.

Meals will be reimbursed at thirty-five dollars (\$35) per day when out-of-County business including travel time, is less than twelve (12) hours.

Meals will be reimbursed at fifty dollars (\$50) per day when out-of-County business including travel time, is twelve hours (12) or more.

Meals from 12:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. will only be reimbursed when overnight lodging is required and approved for the preceding night. See overnight expenses for requirements.

Itemized receipts for all meal expenses must be submitted and may include a meal gratuity, not to exceed 20% per meal, and subject to the daily maximum established by the Board of County Commissioners. Alcohol and entertainment expenses are non-reimbursable. Whenever a meal(s) is provided/included in the registration fee for an authorized conference, training session, or other official County business, the daily maximum amounts described herein shall not apply.

Itineraries, brochures, or other documents describing the conference, training session, or other official county business must be submitted along with all itemized receipts.

**Overnight Expenses**

Overnight stays while on County business may be authorized with pre-approval by the Board of County Commissioners in accordance with ORC 325.20; however, such authorization shall take into consideration the mode of travel authorized and/or travel time involved. Lodging expenses will be reimbursed only with

prior written authorization of the Board of County Commissioners, excluding emergency situations, as determined by the Board. Itemized receipts for such expenses are required.

When considering an employee's request for job-related travel, the Board of County Commissioners will consider the special needs of employees with a disability that substantially affects the employee's ability to drive, see, hear, etc.

**Discussion:** *Kris Lowdermilk, HR Manager, stated this resolution was last updated in 2009 in terms of expense reimbursements. There needed to be more flexibility in terms of travel, due to events going over into the evenings and some may require an overnight stay. The Per Diem rates for meal reimbursement also needed to be more flexible, not all markets are the same as to what it might cost to buy a meal.*

*Commissioner Abbuhl stated gas was a perfect example of flexibility because the Commissioners recently passed a resolution to raise the rate from .55 per mile to .60 per mile temporarily. The personnel policy is a living document and there are times that adjustments need to be made to it.*

*Commissioner Metzger wanted to know if Mr. Lowdermilk was going to send this new update to the departments heads so everyone was aware. Mr. Lowdermilk advised the HR Department would send out the changes.*

*Commissioner Landis commented that he appreciates the work that Mellissa Clark, HR Generalist, and Kris Lowdermilk put into this. There may be situations come up and your work schedule may be 8-5, but you meeting runs over and you need to grab a meal, the employees need this flexibility.*

Work to be performed: Recover the refrigerant from the systems, then remove and dispose of the old equipment. The return air ductwork and air cleaner on the smaller system will remain to be used with the new furnace. For the smaller/west system, install a York TM9E 100,000btuh input 95% gas furnace with ECM blower, 5-ton cooling coil, and 5-ton 13 SEER air conditioner, 3 phase 208/230 volt. For the larger/east system, install twinned(2) York TM9E 80,000btuh input 95% gas furnaces with ECM blower, set on return box, and an 8-ton evaporator mounted on top of furnaces. Outdoor unit is 7.5 ton air conditioner, 3 phase 208/230 volt. Outdoors, connect units to existing refrigerant lines, install new disconnect switches, assure proper circuit protection for units. Indoors, connect refrigerant lines including liquid line driers. Connect AC lines, drains, new digital/programmable thermostats. East/large system: Install media air cleaners on return to furnace, and new return air ductwork as needed. Bring gas line into building from new meterset on 2nd St. side, 1 1/4" sch. 40 steel pipe, across ceiling and properly supported, into furnace room. Provide plugged tee(s), and



This will give our county access to Opioid Funding that will be sent to the regions within the State of Ohio. The County wants to make sure that Region 11 is represented.



**Resolution (442-2022) Approving the OneOhio Region 11 Governance Structure  
Under The OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding**

It was moved by Commissioner Metzger, seconded by Commissioner Landis, that the following Resolution be adopted:

**WHEREAS**, Board of Commissioners ("Jurisdiction"), is a Local Government in Tuscarawas County, Ohio that has adopted and approved The OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding ("The Memorandum"), which establishes a mechanism to disburse settlement proceeds from opioid litigation ("Opioid Funds") into Ohio's communities to help abate the opioid crisis, including allocation of Opioid Funds to Regions through a statewide Foundation Board; and

**WHEREAS**, this Jurisdiction is in **Region 11** under The Memorandum, which is comprised of Belmont, Carroll, Columbiana, Harrison, Holmes, Jefferson, and Tuscarawas counties; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to The Memorandum, Section D.2: "Each Region shall create their own governance structure so it ensures all Local Governments have input and equitable representation regarding regional decisions including representation on the board and selection of projects to be funded from the region's Regional Share...Regions shall have the responsibility to make submissions regarding the allocation of funds to projects that will equitably serve the needs of the entire Region"; and

**WHEREAS**, it is found that the Region 11 governance structure outlined below ensures that all Local Governments in the Region have input and equitable representation regarding regional decisions under The Memorandum; and

**WHEREAS**, the formation of the Region 11 governance structure is of immediate importance to the communities in Region 11, so that imminent Settlement Proceeds committed to the State of Ohio to be distributed per The Memorandum can be disbursed to help abate the Opioid crisis.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by this Jurisdiction that:

Section 1. This Jurisdiction hereby approves the Region 11 governance structure under The OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding ("The Memorandum") as follows:

The OneOhio Region 11 governance structure will initially be comprised of a 21-member founding Board of Directors, consisting of one member from each of the following classes in each county in Region 11:

- One member appointed by the Board of County Commissioners;
- One member appointed by the municipality with the greatest population based on the most recent decennial census;
- The president of the county township association or his or her designee;

and such other members as are unanimously approved by the Region 11 Board members from time-to-time.

The OneOhio Region 11 Board will determine matters consistent with The Memorandum, Section D, such as:

1. adopting or amending Region 11 bylaws, regulations, rules and policies;
2. selecting Region 11's member on the OneOhio Recovery Foundation, Inc. Board ("Foundation Board") under Section D.4. of The Memorandum;
3. electing OneOhio Region 11 Board officers;
4. evaluating and making submissions regarding the allocation of Regional funds throughout the Region;
5. engaging experts, counsel, consultants and vendors as appropriate for these purposes; and
6. taking other actions consistent with Section D.2 of The Memorandum.

This Resolution supersedes all prior Resolutions of this Jurisdiction pertaining to formation of the Region 11 governance structure.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this legislative body relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting, and that all deliberations that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, welfare and safety. The reason for the emergency is to ensure prompt pursuit of funds to assist in abating the opioid epidemic throughout Ohio.

This resolution was reviewed and approved by Robert R. Stephenson II, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney.

**Discussion:** Commissioner Abbuhl introduced Sheriff Deputy Manbeck to acknowledge his heroism. Due to Deputy Manbeck's quick thinking and selfless act, this scenario had a happy ending. Also in attendance is Sheriff Orvis Campbell to present Deputy Manbeck with the Life Saving Award.

Sheriff Campbell stated it was Easter Sunday, Deputy Manbeck was on duty and just going about his day when a fire call came over the radio. This is not usually an officer's responsibility, but he responded to the call. Deputy Manbeck was the first to arrive on scene. The house was engulfed with smoke. Deputy Manbeck crawled under the smoke and located the tenant of the house who was wheelchair bound and had fallen out of his chair. Deputy Manbeck got the gentleman back in his chair and outside to safety. Had Deputy Manbeck not decided to respond to this call, it could have been a very different ending.

Sheriff Campbell stated Deputy Manbeck is a very quiet and humble guy. Deputy Manbeck started his career with the Sheriff's Office at the jail, and now he is assigned to Lawrence Township. Deputy Manbeck is dedicated to our community in many ways, he has been involved with Boy Scouts for most of his life, he volunteers at Polar Express and Dennison Railroad.

Sheriff Campbell commented that he has been with the Sheriff's Office for 29 years and the county for 32 years and has never saved a life. This is not something the Sheriff's Office takes lightly. Sheriff

Campbell presented Deputy Manbeck with a Life Saving Award from the Buckeye State Sheriff's Association and a uniform pin.

Deputy Manbeck introduced his parents, Pam & Dennis Manbeck, and his grandmother, Mary Gordon. Deputy Manbeck thanked the Commissioners and Sheriff Campbell for the award, but stated it is the nature of the job. It was outside the normal scope of Law Enforcement, but he had no problem doing it.

Commissioner Abbuhl added there may not be something that makes the news like with Deputy Manbeck, but a lot of the actions that go on with the Sheriff's Office saves lives. The Commissioners appreciate all of the deputies and the Sheriff that we have in this county and we are very fortunate to have all of you.

Lawrence Township Trustee, Don Ackerman, was present and stated the Township was very appreciative and thankful to have Deputy Manbeck in the Township.

Commissioner Metzger commented this is really a pleasure for the Commissioners, and Deputy Manbeck is a true hero for Tuscarawas County. Mr. Metzger's definition of hero is "not running away from the problem they go right in to solve the problem." Deputy Manbeck did not walk away from the situation or assess it differently and saved a life.

Commissioner Landis stated Deputy Manbeck not only saved a life, but put his own life at risk and that is an important exclamation point on your service to Tuscarawas County and the residents.

Commissioner Abbuhl finished up by saying people learn by example and there is a couple of generations sitting right here that molded Deputy Manbeck into who he is. There is credit due to family history and the apple probably did not fall far from the tree. Mr. Abbuhl thanked the family for the fine man they raised.

Commissioner Abbuhl read the recognition certificate and presented it to Deputy Manbeck.


