It was moved by Commissioner Ress, seconded by Commissioner Abbuhl to approve the Tuscarawas County, Ohio Credit Card Policy for the Commissioner's Office as follows:

Credit Card Policy Tuscarawas County Commissioners

INTRODUCTION

The Tuscarawas County Commissioners recognizes the value of an efficient method of payment and recordkeeping for certain expenses. Therefore, the Tuscarawas County Commissioners permits employees to use county credit cards for the purchase of goods provided the procedures are followed.

CREDIT CARD PROCEDURES

- Credit card(s) can only be used for work related expense and must serve a public purpose.
 Any benefits or rewards accrued from the credit card purchases are to be retained by the County.
- 2. Credit card(s) can only be used by designated employees who have received authorization.
 - Authorized users shall submit to the Board by the first day of each month an estimate of the work-related expenses along with the specific appropriation line items from which the expenditures are to be made. The Board may revise the estimate and determine the amount approved.
- 3. Authorized purchase orders must be obtained prior to use of credit card(s).
- 4. Credit card expenses cannot exceed appropriations. The debt incurred as a result of the purchase is payable with available moneys appropriated to a specific appropriation line item that is appropriate for the purchase.
- 5. There will only be two (2) credit card issued to the Tuscarawas County Commissioners, unless otherwise authorized by the Tuscarawas County Commissioners.
- 6. The Coordinator and Office Manager shall retain credit card(s) in a secured location when not in use.
- 7. The maximum limit on any credit card will not exceed \$5,000.00.
- 8. Purchases must comply with R.C 301.27 and with the policy adopted by the Board of County Commissioners.
- 9. Payments exceeding authorized card policy limits can be approved after the fact. However, if the over expenditure is not approved, the cardholder or office/department and surety are liable.
- 10. ATM, cash advances, gift cards and all other cash-related transactions are strictly prohibited.
- 11. Detailed receipts must be obtained when using credit card(s) and provided to the Coordinator. If the Coordinator is making the purchase, detailed receipts will be reviewed by the Office Manager.
- 12. Itemized receipts are submitted to the Coordinator for review of the items purchased as reflected on the receipts and the purchased items themselves to be certain that:
 - a) Only county-related purchases were made.
 - b) The items purchased were actually received.
- 13. The Coordinator will process a voucher for payment that includes the statement and original receipts, and forward to the Auditor for payment, along with an approved bill listing certified by the Clerk.
- 14. Employees may be held liable for charges if receipts are lost or not provided to the Administrative Assistant.

- 15. In the event credit card(s) cannot be located or are determined to be stolen, employee(s) must contact the credit card company immediately to cancel credit card(s) and must notify the Auditor and Commissioners in writing regarding the same.
- 16. Any employee utilizing credit card(s) inappropriately or without proper authorization will be subjected to disciplinary action, which can include financial reimbursement, revocation of credit card(s) privileges and/or possible criminal charges.
- 17. Offices/Departments shall receive Commissioners' approval prior to paying any late fees, penalties, or interest/finance charges as a result of using the credit card.
- 18. Offices/Departments shall receive Commissioners' approval before making purchases that charge additional fees for credit card purchases. Purchases for consideration shall be proprietary and not able to be purchased elsewhere.
- 19. Employee(s) authorized to utilize credit card(s) will sign a copy of this policy prior to use of credit card(s).

It was moved by Commissioner Ress, seconded by Commissioner Abbuhl, to approve the following memorandum of understanding as approved to form by Kristine Beard, Assistant County Prosecutor:

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE TUSCARAWAS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND THE TUSCARAWAS COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

Whereas, the people of the State of Ohio and its communities have been harmed by misfeasance, nonfeasance and malfeasance committed by certain entities within the Pharmaceutical Supply Chain; and,

Whereas the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners have the discretion to disburse settlement funds received the through the One Ohio Agreement the Board shall make distributions on an annual basis for the duration of the settlement;

Now therefore, the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners (Commissioners) and the Tuscarawas County Sheriff's Department (the Sheriff's Department), enter into this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") relating to the allocation and use of the Opioid funds.

A. Purpose of the MOU

The purpose of this Agreement is to allow for the disbursement of Opioid funds to address the needs of persons involved in the criminal justice system who have Opioid use disorder and any co-occurring substance use disorders or mental health conditions.

B. **Definitions**

As used in this MOU:

- The parties shall be the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners and the Tuscarawas County Sheriff's Department.
- Opioid Funds shall mean the monetary amounts obtained through a settlement negotiated by and between the Pharmaceutical Supply Chain Participant and the State, the Plaintiff's Executive Committee of the National Prescription Opiate Multidistrict Litigation ("PEC") and Ohio Local Governments.
- Approved Purpose(s) shall mean evidence-based forward-looking strategies, programing and services used to:
 - (a) expand the availability of treatment for individuals affected by substance abuse and disorders;

- (b) develop, promote and provide evidence-based substance use prevention strategies;
- (c) provide substance abuse avoidance and awareness education;
- (d) decrease the oversupply of licit and illicit Opioids; and,
- (e) support recovery from addiction services performed by qualified and appropriately licensed providers, as is further set forth in agreed Opioid Abatement Strategies.

C. Allocation of Opioid Funds

- The Commissioners agree to allocate the sum of \$104,200, to the Sheriff's Department.
- 2. The funds shall be disbursed as a lump sum within thirty days of the effective date of this Agreement.
- The Sheriff's Department agrees to use the Opioid funds to provide individuals who have been identified as having an Opioid use disorder and any co-occurring substance use disorders or mental health conditions, with recovery and addiction services by a qualified and appropriate licensed provider.
- 4. The licensed provider shall provide evidence- based treatment, including MAT, evidence-based psychotherapies, recovery support, harm reduction and any other appropriate services to individuals who are incarcerated, leaving the jail, and/or have recently left the jail.
- In addition to the approved uses, treatment services shall be provided in accordance with Federal, State and local regulations for licensed mental health providers.

D. Reporting and Expenditure Requirements

- The Sheriff's Department shall provide an annual accounting to the Commissioners which shall include an itemized statement of how the Opioid funds have been distributed for the purposes described herein.
- 2. All funds shall be expended on or before December 31, 2024.
- 3. All unexpended funds may be subject to recovery by the Commissioners.
- Any expended funds that have been distributed in a manner that is not in accordance with the approved purposes may be recovered by the Commissioners.

E. Miscellaneous

- Renewal: This distribution and/or the distribution amount are renewable annually at the discretion of the Board.
- Effective Date: This Agreement shall become effective on the date it is accepted by Resolution of the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners and shall expire on December 31, 2024.
- 3. Adherence to Mandated purposes: The Sheriff's Department understands that the source of the Opioid Funds is the settlements negotiated by and between the Pharmaceutical Supply Chain Participant and the State, the Plaintiff's Executive Committee of the National Prescription Opiate Multidistrict Litigation ("PEC") and Ohio Local Governments and must therefore be used for the mandated purposes.
- Modifications: Any modifications to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by the parties.
- Complete Understanding: This Agreement constitute the complete understanding of the parties and merge and supersede any and all other discussions, agreements and understandings either oral or written, between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.
- 6. Severability: Whenever possible, each provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted in such a manner as to be effective and valid under applicable law, but if any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid under applicable law, such provision shall be ineffective only to the extent of such prohibition or invalidity, without invalidating the remainder of such provision of this Agreement
- 7. Governing Law: This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Ohio.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE TUSCARAWAS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AND UNITED WAY OF TUSCARAWAS COUNTY

Whereas, the people of the State of Ohio and its communities have been harmed by misfeasance, nonfeasance and malfeasance committed by certain entities within the Pharmaceutical Supply Chain; and,

Whereas the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners have the discretion to disburse settlement funds received through the One Ohio Agreement the Board may make distributions for the duration of the settlements;

Now therefore, the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners (Commissioners) and united Way of Tuscarawas County (United Way), enter into this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") relating to the allocation and use of the Opioid funds.

A. Purpose of the MOU

The purpose of this Agreement is to allow for the disbursement of Opioid funds to provide substance abuse and awareness education regarding the risks associated with Opioid use and any other co-occurring illegal substances and mental health risks.

B. Definitions

As used in this MOU:

- The parties shall be the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners and United Way of Tuscarawas County
- Opioid Funds shall mean the monetary amounts obtained through a settlement negotiated by and between the Pharmaceutical Supply Chain Participant and the State, the Plaintiff's Executive Committee of the National Prescription Opiate Multidistrict Litigation ("PEC") and Ohio Local Governments.
- Approved Purpose(s) shall mean evidence-based forward-looking strategies, programing and services used to:
 - (a) expand the availability of treatment for individuals affected by substance abuse and disorders;

- (b) develop, promote and provide evidence-based substance use prevention strategies;
- (c) provide substance abuse avoidance and awareness education;
- (d) decrease the oversupply of licit and illicit Opioids; and,
- (e) support recovery from addiction services performed by qualified and appropriately licensed providers, as is further set forth in agreed Opioid Abatement Strategies.

C. Allocation of Opioid Funds

- 1. The Commissioners agree to allocate the sum of \$20,000, to the United Way.
- The funds shall be disbursed as a lump sum within thirty days of the effective date of this Agreement.
- 3. The United Way agrees to use the funds for any of the following reasons: address stigma against people with mental illness and substance abuse disorder to encourage intervention; provide education and expand awareness of adverse childhood experiences and psychological trauma associated with mental health and addiction; provide information on mental health and crisis intervention, naloxone administration and suicide prevention; provide public education on drug disposal, take-back disposal and destruction programs; provide education about systems designed to support Opioid use and substance abuse prevention.
- Any use of the funds shall be in compliance with Federal, State, and local regulations.
- Distribution of materials may not be used for any promotional, propaganda, political or funding raising purposes.

D. Reporting and Expenditure Requirements

- United Way shall provide an annual accounting to the Board which shall include an itemized statement of how the Opioid funds have been distributed for the purposes described herein.
- 2. All funds shall be expended on or before December 31, 2024.
- 3. All unexpended funds may be subject to recovery by the Commissioners.
- Any expended funds that have been distributed in a manner that is not in accordance with the approved purposes may be recovered by the Commissioners.

E. Miscellaneous

- Renewal: This distribution and/or the distribution amount are renewable annually at the discretion of the Commissioners.
- Effective Date: This Agreement shall become effective on the date it is accepted by Resolution of the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners and shall expire on December 31, 2024.
- 3. DISCUSSION: ANNUAL WATER QUALITY REPORT – Mike Jones, Sanitary Engineer, presented the Annual Water Quality Report for 2023. We are in compliance with all of the drinking water quality requirements. This report is available on the website at https://tcmsd.org/ccrl. Commissioner Abbuhl stated this is good for the public knowing their drinking water is in compliance. I did not expect anything different because you are very thorough with your duties and we appreciate that.

DISCUSSION: SOLICIT ENGINEERING FIRM QUALIFICATIONS – Mike Jones Sanitary

Engineer, requested to solicit qualifications for an engineering firm for the Wilkshire Hills Emergency Water Transmission Line Project. The line from our main water system to the Industrial Park and the Village of Bolivar is the only way to get water to this area. If there was ever a need for emergency water to get to these areas, we need a secondary line we can tap into. The City of Canton has a 42" inch transmission line running from the Beach City Water Plant. We would put a connection onto that line to be there solely for use only in case of emergency back-up source of water. We were able to acquire just under \$900,000 in Congressional Directed Spending. The next step is to get an engineer to look at the project. The estimated cost for this project should be between \$1.3 – \$1.5 million. Commissioner Abbuhl stated this is a good idea, this is forward thinking. There may not be any issues now, but there may be in the future and we will have the instrument in place to tap into that water source if needed.
